
Interior Design

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
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Medinah Country Club

Architectural Design Interior Design The world-famous Medinah Country Club knew it couldn't rely on its gorgeous architecture alone to remain one of the most coveted private clubs in Chicagoland. Hiring OKW to outline and execute a multi-phased master plan was the first step in revitalizing the Club for its members and guests for decades to come.

As part of the first phase of this grand project, we completed a new freestanding Golf Performance Center, Racquet Center, and redesigned their existing Oasis Restaurant. OKW collaborated with the Planning and Construction Committees to establish the club's specific goals and objectives and to explore the optimal layout and aesthetics to best represent its vision.

The second phase included renovating the Club's grill dining, member bar & lounge, and creating a new outdoor terrace. We are currently working with Medinah on a number of additional projects as their long-term strategic and architectural advisor.













North Shore Country Club

OKW has enjoyed a relationship with North Shore Country Club that started in the early 1990s. What began as renovations to locker rooms, pro shop, mens lounge and kitchens led to a decades-long partnership in which we have authored master plans and design work for virtually every component of the clubhouse and its supporting facilities.

Our recent projects include infully re-programming and renovate all of the club's public spaces in 2016. This included new foyers, ballrooms, creating a new casual grille as well as formal adult dining, two new bars, and a significant remodeling of the golf course facade of the clubhouse.

In the summer of 2022, we finished a new pool campus, which included new pool locker rooms, and an adjacent bar pavilion, which only bolstered the club's already impressive amenities.







Hinsdale Golf Club

Clarendon Hills, Illinois

Hinsdale Golf Club's ambitious plans for a renewal of their lower level inspired OKW Architects and our collaborating partners to create a multi-zone concept that was both new and classic. Faced with a floor plan with dark and underutilized spaces, the Club wanted to more thoughtfully rearrange their bar and dining functions, while expanding their square footage beyond the Club's

Interior Design Coordination Taking inspiration from the original architectural detailing, OKW and our interior design partners borrowed material elements to add a familiar character to the newly opened and expansive space. These included glass patterns, ample use of woods, and the incorporation of beloved fixtures. For the exterior, our team took inspiration from existing materials and brick patterns, incorporating them into the façade to enhance its character and subtly divide the new program areas.

> The project was not without its structural challenges as the expansion required the demolition of a load-bearing exterior wall. To avoid leaving an obstructive columns in the otherwise open space, our design team manufactured a massive steel beam to hold up the Club's second floor.

> The new concept is bright and airy, a comfortable space that has earned accolades from its existing members and their guests. In fact, a 2021 survey showed that 97% of members approved of the renovation, which was also attributed to a marked increase in new member interest.







Ridgemoor Country Club


The leadership of Ridgemoor Country Club saw a noticeable gap in their hospitality treatment of the club: the wet areas of the men's locker room. While the Club itself sports a rich history within the Chicagoland community, the men's showers and spa were lacking in their sophistication.

Lucky for Ridgemoor, OKW's experience both in the Club world and designing impeccable hospitality spaces came in handy. We completely elevated the space, from its dated beige tile to an elegant combination of white stone, wood, and high-contrast tile.

The result is a timeless contemporary space that enlivens the Club experience and adds significant value to each member's day.







Westmoreland Country Club

Among our major recent collaborations is a new winter sports facility, which includes paddle tennis, dining, and a golf learning center. The building is integrated into the Club's outdoor golf practice facilities as well, allowing for fluid synergy with summer activities. The result is a year-round social venue that rises above the traditional functions of a paddle hut.

Building upon the success of the paddle and golf learning facility, Westmoreland asked OKW to renovate the men's and women's locker room facilities, as well as the adjacent card room and lounge spaces.

As part of a longer view of the club's operations and membership needs, OKW also studied a variety of other spaces in and around the campus, including ballrooms, member dining, pool dining/entertainment, and administrative offices.





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Butterfield Country Club

These projects have included a renovation and expansion of the pro shop building and interiors, new pool house and dining pavilion, and a new paddle facility.

The new pool and dining pavilion, in conjunction with the tennis complex to the south, gives BCC a new family destination at the heart of the campus. Members enjoy an expanded tennis environment, improved dining options, and a new kiddie pool for the club's young families. While building on BCC's architectural heritage, these facilities offer modern amenities that keep the club looking to the future.

The new paddle complex is the first building seen upon entering the club property. As a result, it was designed to be not only the heart and soul of racquet activity at the club, but as a gateway building setting the architectural tone for all other club facilities. Besides paddle tennis activity, the building is used year-round for private parties and club events.





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Ruth Lake Country Club

Using member surveys and workshops, the Ruth Lake Country Club leadership established four high-priority projects and hired OKW for planning and design.

Working in collaboration with the club's Board of Directors and Strategic Planning Committee, OKW developed planning options for each project component. These included (1) the location and design of a new paddle tennis facility, (2) a total reconfiguration and expansion of the pool house, (3) the renovation of the pool deck and kid's play area, and (4) the relocation of golf cart storage and golf services facilities to a new, below-grade location. In addition, we expanded the dining terrace and created a new men's lounge and co-ed practice facility.

OKW provided design and planning services, developed budgets with the Club and their General Contractor, created the exhibits, and participated in presentations to the Club's membership.

We wore many hats during the process. Make no mistake, there was architecture and planning work to be done. But just as importantly, we had to work as facilitators and advocates for the big changes to come by helping the Club's Board of Directors generate support within their membership to achieve project approval.

Once everyone was on board, we relocated the entrance drive, expanded parking, created a new racquet sports area (including tennis pavilion and courts), added a new pool, kiddie pool, renovated the pool house, created a new grille, and finally, expanded cart storage and caddie facilities.

We later went on to renovate the clubhouse facade, improve the Club's hardscape and landscape, as well as its ballroom, member grille, corridors, and lobby.













Racine Country Club

Architectural Design Interior Design In 2017, a group of Club members donated one golf simulator to membership. With a taste of the technology, a generous member funded the construction of a state-of-the-art, 8,000 SF golf-centric lodge. Given the Club members' affinity for the sport and the forward-thinking, cutting-edge nature of the project, Membership has called it a true game-changer.

When completed in 2022, the Billows Lodge will include six heated bays for outdoor use, as well as four indoor simulators that not only allow members to play their favorite worldwide courses from the comfort of their club, they double as entertainment offerings for members' children.

The innovative plan and design for the Lodge also makes it a more valuable and relevant asset for the Club as it effectively becomes a yearround event space. Members will be able to enjoy such winter activities as sledding, snowshoeing, and cross-country skiing and the outdoor fire pits will further push the social calendar through the colder months of the year.

The Billows Lodge also includes a bar, kitchen, new bathrooms, and staff offices.

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Project **process**

Private clubs from their inception were created to satisfy the needs and tastes of its members. The first step towards designing, renovating, or repurposing facilities for a club must therefore begin with a broad and meaningful understanding of its members, its history, and its aspirations. OKW does this through in-person conversations with the club's designated representatives and its embracing of the research and efforts leading to this RFP.

From the project's inception through construction, the design process will be a collaborative effort between OKW's staff and the Club's leadership. By presenting and reviewing the evolving design at key stages, our partnership refines the vision using input from the entire design team, and brings to life a space that its members will love.

We can further add value to our clients through our detailed knowledge of the private club industry, which is in a constant state of change. Our recommendations and decisions are rooted in both our deep understanding of the business of construction and our decades-long expertise within the sphere of private clubs. Our expertise lies in combining our thought leadership with the specific expectations of each Club to maximize its potential as a social, athletic, and cultural hub.

We consider ourselves trusted advisors to our clients. 


QA/QC methodology

OKW has implemented a QA/QC process that helps us reduce/minimize drawing errors and omissions. These errors cost money – sometimes our own – as well as time and relationships. We work diligently to improve our efforts in this area with a program we have developed that includes the following five discrete steps:

- **Review** current processes, including checklists, deliverables, and the team's understanding of the project's details
- **Identify** weaknesses or deficiencies, take the necessary actions to correct them, and provide training or additional support as required
- **Standardize** and **stabilize** workflow to maximize efficiency wherever possible in order to provide a more targeted focus on the project's unique details
- Measure ongoing performance from design and financial perspectives to audit QA/QC efforts
- **Improve** wherever possible to bolster value of QA/QC process to client and our designers

OKW has a team of ten professionals which comprise our QA/QC Committee. This group meets twice a month to challenge best practices and improve project communication in-house, while continually serving the PMs and PAs as a resource for improved documentation.
